a. **OVERALL PURPOSE OF THE ROLE**: Overall purpose of the role, put simply, why it exists.

The overall purpose of the role is to: conduct enquiries for the grant, variation and renewal of firearm, shot gun and explosive certificates, ensuring compliance with the relevant legislation, Home Office guidance and Force advice. Carry out HSE role in relation to compliance issues with explosive storage and certification up to 2000kg stores and all certification of acquire and keep except manufacture .To attend court and provide evidence in relation to revocations and refusal on section 1 and section 2 firearms. To conduct enquiry's in relation to compliance concerns and provide support to response teams in relation to firearms licencing.

b. **KEY ACCOUNTABILITY AREAS**: Defines the important aspect of the role for which the job holder is responsible for results or outcomes.

The key result areas at the 3F entry level are as follows:

- 1. Receive, evaluate and investigate applications for certificates under Firearm and Explosive legislation. Prepare detailed and accurate reports to outline issues identified and compliance requirements.
- 2. Interview applicants and others concerning applications, issues and variations to current certification, ensure good reason for firearms is maintained and to report any identified concerns as to applicants suitability and submit reports to the Force Firearms Licensing Manager.
- 3. Advise the public and police on the legal possession, security and safe shooting of firearms, ammunition have a good working level in relation to firearms legislation and home office guidance on safety and security. Explosives legislation advise on storage, security and other licencing requirements, both verbally and in writing. Be able to work utilising the HSE guidance contained within 150 and 151 HSE guidance documents relating to explosives.
- 4. Whilst supervised, inspect Registered Firearms Dealers and Shooting Club premises and provide advice or action as necessary in accordance with home office guidance and legislation
- 5. Service notice of revocation or refusal of certificate for firearm and shotgun, seizing firearms/shotguns and certificates when required. Receive cash and cheque payments on behalf of applicants.
- 6. Attend both Magistrate and Crown court as necessary in connection with appeals or as a witness.

Key result areas at the 3G level role are as follows (in addition to the above accountabilities)

- 1. Conduct site explosives enquiries and higher level firearms enquiries by becoming a Health and Safety Inspector.
- 2. Survey a storage site and identify the correct level of Explosives that can be safely stored and be able to advise as to requirements under HSE 150 and 151 guidance documents on explosive storage security and safety.

- 4. Undertake inspections of shooting clubs and premises without supervision. Ensure compliance with the Firearms Acts and supporting Home Office guidance. Be able to recognise and manage breaches in requirements and take appropriate action.

Manage time effectively, prioritise work load and deliver reports in a timely manner. Good working understanding of requirements contained within HSE 150 and 151 in conjunction with the Explosive regulations 2014 as amended. Understand responsibilities given under Health and Safety Act in carrying out the HSE inspector role, issue of HSE improvement notices and impact and accountability of actions in this area.

Firearms and Explosives Enquiry Officer is a very niche role requiring an ongoing commitment to learn / update the role holder's firearms / explosives knowledge. The role holder must ensure they maintain an awareness of the relative legislation to ensure they are being compliant.
