a. **OVERALL PURPOSE OF THE ROLE**: Defines the role, put simply, why it exists.

*The overall purpose of the role is to:* Contribute to the accreditation and compliance of forces' systems with legal, national and local IA requirements in support of the ISO/IEC 27001 Information Security Management System (ISMS).

b. **KEY ACCOUNTABILITY AREAS**: Define the important aspect of the role for which the job holder is responsible for results or outcomes.

## The key result areas in the role are as follows:

1. Maintain the accreditation of the forces' systems and maintain compliance with national and local standards such as Codes of Connection providing pragmatic, cost-effective solutions for exchanging information. Identify business information risks and propose recommendations for mitigation to management.

2. Contribute to the development, maintenance and testing of the forces' ICT Disaster Recovery and Business Continuity Plans ensuring the availability of forces' information.

3. Contribute to the development of standards, policies, processes and procedures to support the ISMS and ensuring the security of forces' information.

4. Contribute to the creation and delivery of guidance, user education and operational procedures to support the ISMS. Cultivate relationships with stakeholders in order to raise awareness and proactively contribute to improving the two forces' adherence to information assurance standards.

5. Provide initial response and management of information security incidents, escalating to the Assurance Lead as appropriate, in order to ensure incidents are dealt with effectively.

6. Provide security requirements, in line with forces' policies and procedures, for 3<sup>rd</sup> party and supplier contracts and agreements to support the on-going effectiveness of the ISMS.

7. Delivery of information assurance requirements advice on new and existing ICT systems, advising and assisting project boards and Technical Architects to ensure that controls are proportionate, pragmatic, cost-effective and commensurate with national and local requirements.

8. Assist the forces' Accreditors through preparing and reviewing risk management documents and technical risk assessments. Represent the Information Assurance Team Lead at local, regional and national meetings in relation to information security and assurance, as required, and provide peer support and assistance when appropriate.

c. **DIMENSIONS**: Include matters as key result areas that make the greatest demands on the role holder, seasonal pressures, items processed, the number of customers and/or level of authority to make financial decisions or commit other resources
